Saunders; Irishmen, R. Tilson and W. Palmer; Victorias, E. Harrick; secretary, B. Tierney, and vice-president, J. B. Ahern. The main business transacted was the adopting of the schedules for the senior and junior series as follows:

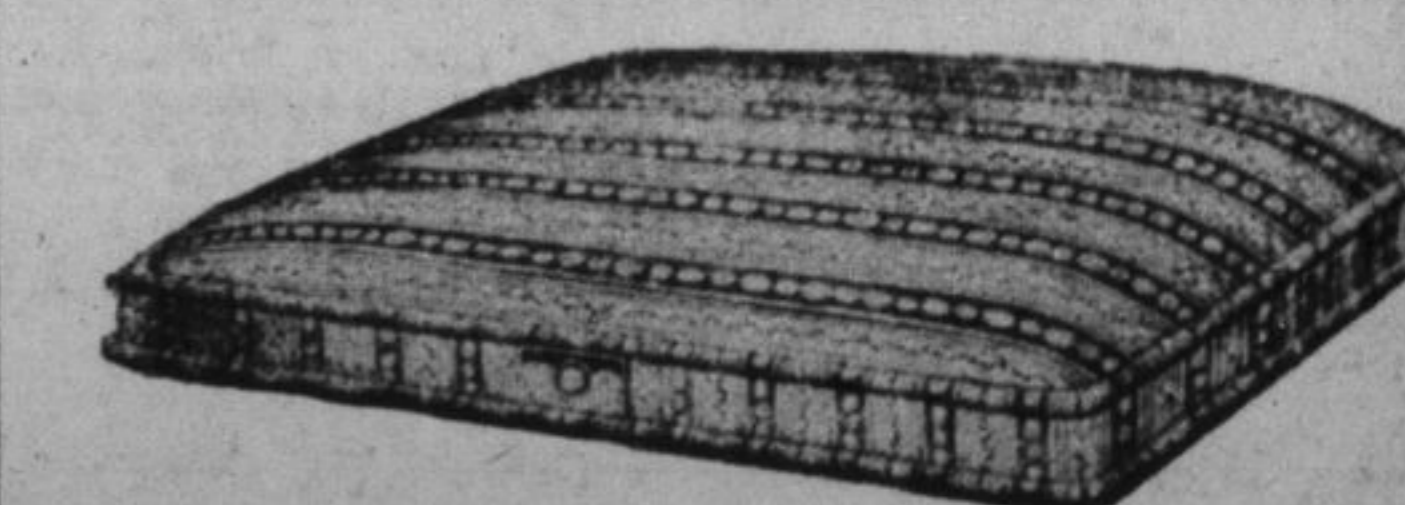
