ANY person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba. Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency, on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteaders.

Duties.—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres solely owned and occupied by him or by his father mother, son, daughter, brother or sister. In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter section alongside his homestead. Price \$3.90 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the time required to earn homestead patent) and cultivate fifty acres extra.

London, May 10 .- George V. was

formally proclaimed King of England and all its dominions on Monday. All the georgeous pomp and display that have marked this ceremony since medieval days were observed. No evidences of mourning were permitted, in accordance with the ancient custom, all flags being raised from half-mast to the top for the occasion. The heralds, with the pursuivants, kings-at-arms, etc., entered the city, and read the proclamation at Charing Cross, Temple Bar and the Royal Exchange, the reading being received with the royal salute, the playing of the National Anthem and the dipping of the colors. This ceremony concluded, the lord mayor entertained the heralds at the Mansion House, the first toast being to the new king.
