Duties—Must reside six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the time required to earn homestead patent) and cultivate fifty acres extra. A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price, \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$300.00.

RECEIPTS HEAVIER FOR MONTH OF APRIL.

Everything Offered This Week Likely Butter Market Suffered Break in

Montreal, May 11.—The market or cheese, last week, closed with a lightly better feeling apparent, owing to a visibly increased demand at the lower prices reached, but the opening this week has not been quite as auspicious. The demand from Great Britain seems to have fallen off somewhat, and trade is quiet. The prices current, however, are comparatively low, and most dealers feel that everything available this week should be picked up at about present quotations, and are taking their usual lots at country markets.

At Campbellford on Tuesday morning the offerings were all picked up at 10 5-8c per lb. at factories, and at Stirling in the afternoon a portion of the offerings sold at the same price, but the best prices offered for the balance was 10 9-16c, which price the factorymen finally accepted. Un-less there is a speedy improvement in the demand from Great Britain we may see even lower prices at the narkets at the end of the week, as uyers will not maintain prices uness they have some encouragement

The receipts of cheese into Mont real during the past week showed a dight falling off as compared with he corresponding week last year, although the receipts during the month f April were heavier, the actual dre figures for the week being 9,855 as compared with 11,036 for last year.
