BY THE PRESS TO THE LATE E. J. B. PENSE. More Men of His Type are Needed in Ontario—A Man of Strong Individuality. Toronto News: Journalists will regret the death of E. J. B. Pense, of Kingston. For more than a third of a century he was a conspicuous figure in Canadian journalism.

Of Strong Individuality. Montreal Herald: The sudden death of E. J. B. Pense, of the Kingston Whig, removes one of the best known and most striking figures in Ontario journalism. He was a man of strong individuality, and this, coupled with his fine public spirit, made him one of Kingston's most influential and valuable citizens.

More of His Stamp Needed. Toronto Star: An upright and able servant of his city and his province passed away on Saturday, in E. J. Pense, ex-M.P.P., proprietor of the Kingston Whig, and a well-known figure in political life. For thirty-eight years proprietor of the Whig, and connected with that excellent newspaper for, in all, nearly half a century, Mr. Pense was widely known as a journalist.

Honor to Canadian Journalism. Hamilton Herald: The sudden death of E. J. B. Pense is a severe loss to Kingston, of which city he was the leading citizen. As editor and publisher of the Whig for many years, Mr. Pense was an honor to Canadian journalism. He was a partisan of the better type, one who was big and independent enough to stand for what was good in his party without doing what was evil and weak.
