GANANOQUE BOY RENDERED UNCONSCIOUS.

Exemption for Jones Shovel Works Before Town Council—Special Legislation Required—A Pancake Tea.

Gananoque, May 13.—Frederick Mullings, youngest son of Mr. and Mrs. Sidney Mullins, Brook street, met with a severe accident while fixing the awning at Mrs. T. O. Middleton's milliner shop. Standing on a step-ladder he became overbalanced and fell off the grandolithic walk and was picked up insensible. Medical aid was summoned and the lad removed to his home where he was found to have no bones broken.

A special session of the town council was held on Wednesday evening at Bellevue to consider the question of the twenty-year exemption from taxation of the proposed extension to the D. F. Jones company's shovels works. As the municipal act permits only a term not exceeding ten years it was decided to communicate with Premier Whitney re legislation in the matter.

Emperor William has authorized the Kiel Yacht Club to announce that he will give a prize for American-German sonderklass yacht races to be sailed off Kiel in 1911, under the same conditions that prevailed in 1905.

According to a dispatch from San Francisco, the district attorney is not sure whether the contest between Jeffery and Johnson is to be a boxing match or prize fight, and that he will announce his decision one of these days. There is a considerable difference because the laws of California allow boxing matches and taboo prize fights.

The Ontario Jockey Club has a sur-

plus of \$250,000, and now that the racing law has been set upon the statute books of the land, it will soon begin the construction of its new plant. The land has been purchased on the heights to the east of Toronto, and the site is about four miles from Woodbine track. It is a beautiful location, and it is intended to put thereon the finest racing grounds on this side of the Atlantic ocean.

The rearrangement of the Ontario Jockey Club dates will in no way affect the meetings at the other tracks of the Canadian Racing Association. Woodbine now opens on Victoria Day (May 24th), instead of a week from next Saturday, to continue seven weeks, the spring circuit being as follows: Woodbine Park, May 24-31; 18-25; Fort Erie, June 2-9; Windsor, July 16-23.
