## SEEK THE REMOVAL

DISPOSITION OF CARTMEN IN OGDENSBURG.

Handsome Block Has Been Built in Isabella Street and the Owner Objects to Their Presence at Their Old Stand in Front of His Property.

Ogdensburg, N.Y., May 21.—This city has a municipal problem which is causing the common council much anxiety. There are fifty licensed carters and these men with their horses and wagons have been allowed to use a section of Isabella street as a stand for many years. A handsome block was recently completed near the stand and the owner and tenants are demanding the removal of the draymen who block the walk and obstruct the street. Efforts to secure a location for a stand have so far failed and the council is losing its patience. No one wants the stand near his place of business and efforts have been made to rent vacant lots for such purpose.

In the meantime the owner of the block is threatening to sue the city on the ground that his property is being damaged and alleging that the council had no right to designate that block as a carters' stand. Several aldermen have expressed themselves in favor of simply having the police order the carters off the block, so long used as a stand and let them get a location from which they will not be subject to "move along" orders from the policemen.

At the police court, on Saturday, over an hour was taken up in the hearing of a charge which was finally dismissed by the magistrate, William Kelly, charged Stanislas Drycaw, with threatening to take his life.
