## NO BLAME ATTACHED TO TRAIN CREW IN GANANOQUE FATALITY.

Evidence Showed Train That Killed Mrs. Robert Johnson Was Going at Slow Pace—Crew Took All Precautions.

Gananoque, May 27.—The adjourned coroner's inquest into the cause of the death of the late Mrs. Robert Johnson, of Atkinson, was resumed last evening before Coroner Dr. Shaw, of Lansdowne. Stephen Dory, Adolphus White, Elbert Wheeler and Alexander Harris were the first witnesses called and corroborated in the main the details of evidence produced at the former investigation. Four employees of the T. I. R. Co. were next called and their evidence corroborated speed of train as usual and nothing unusual in any details of their work that morning. Henry Abrams, former engineer of the company, gave expert testimony as to rate necessary to run two cars of that weight into that siding, three or four miles-an hour being the limit. George Pratt, fireman, corroborated the evidence of witnesses as to his actions in trying to stop the horse. Engineer Irving R. Stollker gave every explanation, which on entering siding and rang bell. Whistled for crossing, rang again, but could not see. Fireman Pratt's signal on account of the S shape of the Jones company siding. Conductor Alfred R. Green ran from where he had been unloading freight to street, tried to stop horse, waving his arms to the lady in the buggy, man to engine and told engineer to stop. The entire evidence from the company's employees showed that no one of the train's crew of engineer, fireman and conductor had been in any degree lax in their duties.
