Synopsis of Canadian North-West Land Regulations.

ANY person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person before the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any Agency on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteaders.

Duties—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of the first three years. A homestead may be entered by him or by his father, brother, son, daughter, brother or sister.

In certain districts a homestead may be entered by a person who has resided six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the date of homestead entry) including the date of homestead entry.
