### Synopsis of Canadian North-West Land Regulations.

ANY person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion land, including Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency of Sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteaders.

**Duties.**—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of five years. A homesteader must live within five miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister. In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section alongside his homestead. Price, \$1.00 per acre. Duties.—Must reside six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price, \$3.00 per acre. Duties.—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$200.00.

## FORTUNE FOR CHILD

ROMANTIC STORY OF LITTLE GIRL REVEALED.

Heir to Wealth From the U.S. Treasury—Now Cared for by Rich Foster Parents.  
Chicago, June 21.—Somewhere in Chicago, cared for by wealthy foster parents, six-year-old Mildred Souigny pursues her way sublimely ignorant of the search being made for her by her natural parents and detectives in their employ. She is ignorant of the fact that she is the daughter of an Osage Indian squaw, and as such is entitled to an estate in money and lands which by the time she attains legal age, will be worth upward of \$175,000.  
Mildred was born in St. Mary's hospital, Chicago, January 18th, 1901, the offspring of a clandestine marriage which both parties wished kept secret. In the face of existing circumstances the mother agreed to abandon the child before returning to the Osage reservation in Oklahoma. A prominent Chicago physician then attached to the hospital promised to find a home for the baby. Mildred was adopted by a wealthy, childless couple, whose identity was known only to the head of the institution and the physician who arranged the adoption.  
Before the adoption the foster parents insisted that neither the real parent for the child be allowed to know the true status of the case. This was agreed to, and all parties were satisfied.  
But the entire aspect of the case was changed two years later when congress enacted a law requiring the enrolment of all members of the Osage nation, the richest tribe in North America per capita, and the appointment of a trial judge and jury. Immediately Mildred's parents requested her enrolment, furnishing the office of the commissioner of Indian affairs in this city with the required proof of her birth and existence. The necessary evidence was furnished by the Chicago physician, who, however, refused to divulge her whereabouts.  
The stumbling block, and the factor that brought the Indian commissioner into the case, appeared when the Indian agent for the Osage tribe insisted that the mother show proof that the child would be benefited by the annuities from the estate, which the mother wished to draw. At the same time local attorneys, acting for the Osage tribe, on the assumption that the child for which annuities were claimed, was nothing more material than the offspring of a pliant imagination, asked the interior department for proof that the little girl existed.  
Again the Chicago physician was appealed to. He called in the foster parents. They refused absolutely to allow their identities to be divulged, the foster father declaring that by the terms of his will, he had made Mildred heiress to a far greater estate than she ever would acquire from the Osage nation, and that, as she was ignorant of her mixed lineage, and would be happier in that ignorance, he would insist that the original intentions of the contract be adhered to.  
There this strange case rests, so far as the federal authorities are concerned. The estate continues to pile up money in Mildred's name in the United States treasury, and will continue to do so far as the authorities are concerned, until the Osage nation proves not only that Mildred is dead but that she died without heirs.

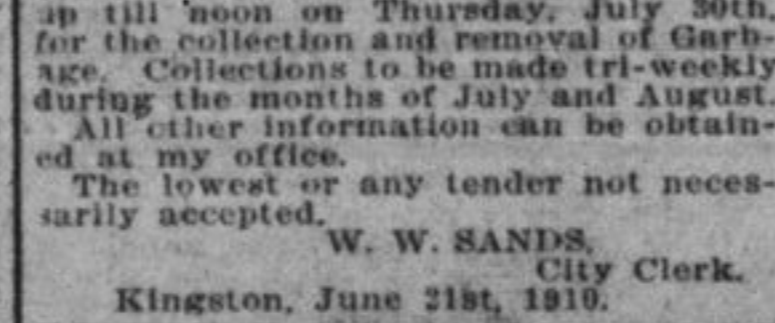

## SEARCHING FOR PAIR

**Who Are Concerned in Husband's Murder.**  
Portland, Oregon, June 21.—A state wide search for A. C. Powers and Mrs. William A. Johnson, was begun, today, following the discovery of the woman's husband in a trunk at the Union Station here.
