Deadwood, S.D., June 23 .- As far back as 1864, when he was a raw newspaper correspondent at Car-son City, Nev., Mark Twain showed the humor that afterward was to be the dominant characteristic of his life. The story of how he posed as a horse thief, and the photograph he used for that purpose, have never been published. They are in the possession of Maj. A. J. Simmons, of Deadwood, former chum of Ulemens, and one the co-conspirators in the joke, Maj. Simmons, Clemens, and the late Judge William H. Claggett, of Deadwood, were intimate friends in Carson City in 1864, just at the time when three horse thieves were being sought by the vigilantes. Twain conceived the idea of posing as the criminals and took Simmons and Claggett to the hotographers, where the trio had their pictures taken together. 
