

Synopsis of Canadian North-West Land Regulations.

ANY person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency, on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader.

Duties—Six months' residence, upon actual cultivation of the land in each of time required to earn homestead (present) and cultivate fifty acres extra.

A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 10 acres, solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter section alongside his homestead. Price, \$1.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the pre-emption). May take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price, \$2.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years. Pre-emptive fifty acres and erect a house worth \$200.00.
