One Camp Was Totally Destroyed, a High Wind-They Sought Re

This time of the year considerable more exciting than a bush fire, and n a very short time, a plaze of this writing from Residency 13 on the T. . R. construction survey, J. Grady, a well known young Kingstonian re-lers to the raging fires as follows:

"P. Courtney, one of O'Brien's con-ractors, situated at Mileage 147, or 00 miles west of Cochrane, was burn umcrous bush fires now raging. The otal camp was destroyed, damage, \$25,000, partly covered by insurance. Fire was first seen coming from the west about 2 p.m., and by 3.30, every-thing was in ruins. It is supposed to have started from stationmen burning rush on the right of way. It covered about six miles in an hour, but then ook a northerly course, and judging com the dense smoke, it is still raging. Fanned along by a high wind, it made great headway, through the ridges of large birch and jackpine.

The men gought refuge in the Val-

antyne River, a quarter of a mile away. In this they stood up to their necks, and to keep from burning, as the fire swept by, kept continually ducking under the water. The river literally ran cinders, after the fire passed over it. One man, Daniel Egan, suffered severe burns on the arms and face, and was hurried to the hospital at the

Missanabi River, 35 miles away.
"Owing to the foresight of Courtney himself, wreat loss of live was averted. The powder house, containing five tons of dynamite and one hundred cases of black powder, had just been banked with clay, two feet thick. Eight horses, which were cut loose, saved themselves by running directly west through the fire. The men never saved a thing, except the clothes they were wearing, and even these were burned from
