He Was Supreme Treasurer of the Foresters. Toronto, July 13. Thomas Lawless, supreme treasurer for the Independent order of Foresters, died this morning, at his home, at 321 Leppard avenue, after an illness of about ten days. Mr. Lawless was about sixty-seven years of age and a native of Quebec, having been born in the village of St. Boni, near Montreal, where he was a journalist in his younger days. After occupying various minor posts in the order, Mr. Lawless was appointed supreme auditor of the I.O.F. in 1898. He held this position for ten years, when he became assistant chief ranger which position he occupied until he appointed supreme treasurer in 1909. SWIFT'S Synopsis of Canadian North-West Land Regulations. ANY person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, may obtain a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District, and pay the purchase money in each of three years, or make such arrangement with respect to the date of payment as may be approved by the Department of the Interior. A homesteader who has obtained his homestead rights and cannot obtain a pre-emption may take a purchase of the same land in each of three years, but must in each of three years settle on the land and erect a house worth \$100.
