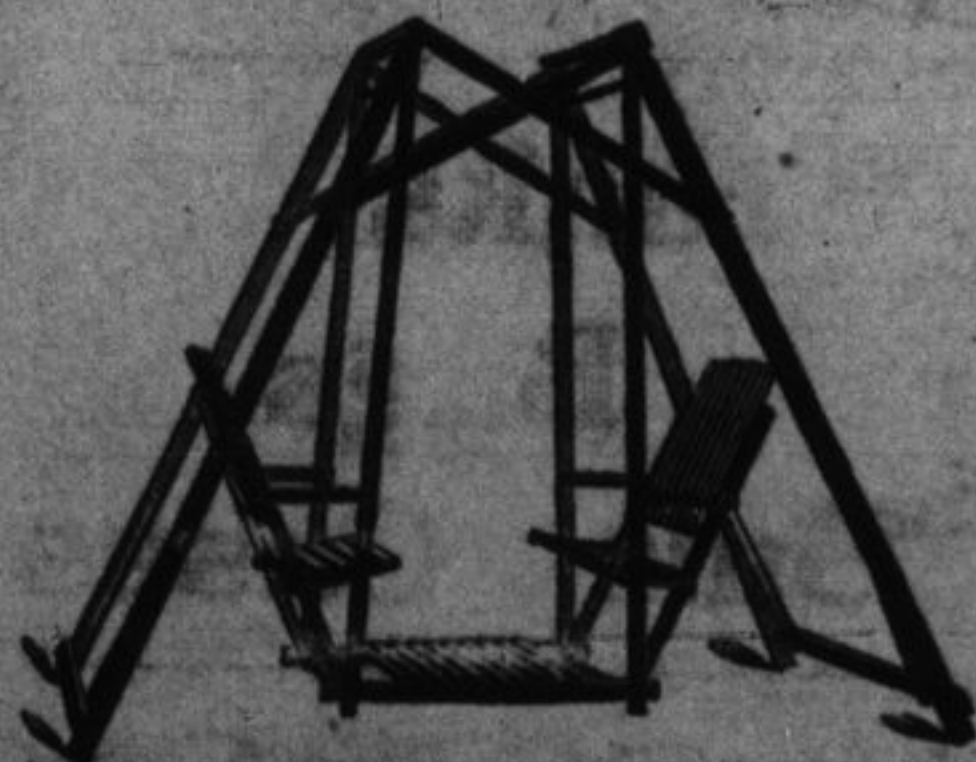

GANANOQUE GUNNERS

SHOT FOR SILVER CUP GIVEN BY NEW YORKER.

Frank Dillon, of Seely's Bay, Was the Winner—R. B. Britton Won Dingley Race—Merchants Complain of Poor Business.

Gananoque, Aug. 11.—The third of the series of four week dinghy races, under the auspices of the Gananoque Yacht Club, was sailed yesterday afternoon. The finish was: First, Chuma, sailed by R. B. Britton; second, Seat, sailed by R. M. Harris; third, Cass, sailed by H. L. Cristander; fourth, Base, sailed by N. Wood; fifth, Lolapalusa, Alfred Ogden. After the races five o'clock tea was served by the ladies.

LIVELY DISCUSSIONS

On Theological Teaching—Fate of Dr. Carman. Toronto, Aug. 11.—Another red-hot battle of words over theological teaching in Methodist colleges is expected to be unavoidable at the general conference of the Methodist church in Canada, which opens next week in Victoria, B.C.

Another knotty problem that the general conference must face is the fate of Rev. Albert Carman, the veteran general superintendent of the church in Canada. While Dr. Carman is getting to be a very old man, there is no doubt as to the loyalty to him felt by a large proportion of the church members. While some do not agree with all his views, there is a feeling that the church should retain him as long as possible. The suggestion will, no doubt, be made that his work should be eased by the appointment of an assistant.

The probability is that the grey-haired superintendent will not be asked to retire, or defeated in the election. It is pointed out that the pope of Rome is never deposed. He rules till death removes him. So do Anglican and Roman Catholic bishops and archbishops. So do the Methodist bishops in the United States.

It is expected that the coming conference will be the most eventful held in the history of Canada. The prediction is made that almost all the clergy will be there, and that ninety per cent. of the laity elected to go will be in Vancouver for it.

HOCUSSED BY CITY.

Wants Return of Money for Alleged Brother's Funeral. New York, Aug. 11.—An indignant woman in Los Angeles, Mrs. M. G. Donnelly, threatens to bring suit against the city of New York unless the city refunds to her the money she spent in providing burial for the body of a man, which through the mistake of a city clerk, she thought was that of her brother. In a letter received by the charities department, Mrs. Donnelly says that New York must settle the bill.

On June 19th last John Doyle, Mrs. Donnelly's brother, was admitted to the city home and was discharged on July 18th. He gave as reference the name of Mrs. Donnelly and another sister who lives in Cincinnati. There was another John Doyle in the city home, at the same time. This John Doyle seems to have had no friends or relatives, and he died July 8th.

Mrs. Donnelly was notified that her brother was dead and she sent money for the funeral expenses. A little later she received a letter from her brother saying that he had recovered.
