TO PUT IN STITCHES

DOG BITES GIRL; REMORSE FOLLOWS.

Animal Displays Unique Trait After Injuring Little Playmate—Episode at Smith's Falls.

Smith's Falls, Aug. 23.—Little Ada Hay, daughter of Stephen Hay, Hallville, was playing with the family dog, when the animal bit her face. Her left cheek and the corner of her mouth were so lacerated that it required nine stitches to close the wounds. Remorse evidently overtook the dog, as he left home, and wandered disconsolate for two days, refusing food.

DISCIPLINE IN ARMY. Privates Must Not Talk Back to Sergeants.

New York, Aug. 23.—Because John C. Strait, of the 2d recruit company at Sergeant's Island, "talked back" to Sgt. Vester Etkner, he is doing three months of hard labor at the army post with the exception of the last fourteen days in each month. These he spends in solitary confinement on bread and water. General Grant approved the sentence of the court-martial. It was shown that while driving a team Strait's work did not suit the sergeant, who called him down. In reply Strait said: "If I am not driving to suit you get some one else." The court-martial for insubordination followed.

Couple Murdered by Thieves. Wilmington, Del., Aug. 23.—Robert Casey, Jr., keeper of a general store on the Philadelphia and Wilmington turnpike at Claymont, near here, and his wife, were murdered in their beds, in the house over the store, some time during last night, evidently while they slept. The murder was committed by thieves, who also plundered the house and store, breaking open the safe, and carrying off all of the contents of value. Mr. and Mrs. Casey were the only occupants of the house.

The crime was committed with a club about an inch thick and a foot long. With this the heads of the victims were battered in, after which the club was thrown beside the bed. The murder was discovered by Warrion Reel, a driver for a Wilmington livery, who had come to the store to deliver bread.

Samuel Godfrey, a helper in the moulding department of the James Smart works, Brockville, lies in agony at St. Vincent de Paul hospital, as a result of terrible burns received while at work Saturday afternoon. He fell into molten metal.

William Blecker, grandson of Belleville's first settler, died at the age of eighty-seven, on Saturday.

STOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST LAND REGULATIONS.

ANY PERSON WHO IS THE SOLE head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta.

The applicant must be a citizen of the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency, on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader.

Notice—Six months' residence upon cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live with his family on his homestead or a farm of at least 50 acres, wholly owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing, may pre-empt a quarter section along his homestead. Price,
