homesteader.

Dutles.—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter section alongside his homestead. Price, \$3.00 per acre. Dutles—Must reside upon the homestead or pre-emption six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the time required to earn homestead patent) and cultivate fifty acres extra.

A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emtpion may enter for a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price, \$3.00 per acre. Dutles—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$300.00.

William Dunn, of 151 Elevado Drive, Pasedena, California, formerly a tin-smith and alderman of Kingston, is the inventor of a new warm air fur nace and heater which is expected to revolutionize the heating of houses and buildings. Mr. Dunn has spent a number of years in working out his plans for the heater and authoritie who have investigated his patent state that it is all the inventor repre-

Patents are now pending on the heater. Dunn & Barnett, of Mission street and Fair Oaks avenue, Sout Pasadena, are the manufacturers the stoves and furnaces. The stoves are made in four sizes and the fu

The feature of the heater which finds instant favor among those who have investigated, is the fact that it is impossible to detect even the slightest odor of gas when the heater is working or when the gas is turned on the chambers without being lighted. The sanitary arrangement has been perfected to such an extent that it is possible to leave the gas turned on and remain in the room without suf-
