

Using Left-Over Apples. There is money even in poor quality apples, and Australian growers are deriving considerable profit from apples formerly thrown away. An apple-evaporating plant has been introduced, and a new industry started, which last year yielded profit of over \$5,000,000. The machines pare and core the apples, which are then sliced into chips and dried. Even the cores and skin peelings are utilized, being exported to France for the manufacture of vincear, sauces, etc.




