Lord Althorp, Who Succeeds, is Widely Known.

Spencer's new earl has been a member of the House of Lords for the last four years, having been raised to the Italian Postal Clerk Secures, About peerage as Lord Althorp in 1906, on the occasion of his appointment to the office of Lord Chamberlain, which he still holds. The Italian over, he is a man of very chivalrous Lord Revelstoke, and of the other rendering to them her dowry. Among the sobriquets which were applied to him in the lower House was that of "Bradlaugh's Baby," owing to his political connec-tion with Northamptonshire, with which county the first professed atheist to occupy a seat in Parliament was identified. That he is a man of some pluck is shown by the fact that


