SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH WEST LAND REGULATIONS. ANY PERSON WHO IS THE SOLE head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alterta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Subagency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency, on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, aughter, brother or sister of intending omesteader.

Duties.—Six months' residence upon d cultivation of the land in each of ree years. A' homesteader may live thin nine miles of his homestead on farm of at least 80 acres solely owned ad occupied by him or by his father, other, son, daughter, brother or sister. In certain districts a homesteader in In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter section alongside his homestead. Price, \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside upon the homestead or pre-emption six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the time required to earn homestead patent) and cultivate fifty acres extra.


A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emiplon may enter for a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price. \$3.90 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate lifty acres and erect a house worth \$300.00.
