IRON IN ONTARIO

HIGH MINES IN LANARK AND FRONTENAC.

American Interests Now Developing the Properties—Mines at Wilbur Will Ship 2,000 Tons a Day—Over 40,000,000 tons of Ore in Sight.

The Canadian public and especially the people of Eastern Ontario will be greatly interested in the announcement which has just been made that the iron ore deposits, lying along the route of the Kingston and Pembroke railway, are to be developed by American capitalists. These ore bodies are situated near Wilbur and Robertsonville in the counties of Lanark and Frontenac, and comprise altogether 17,237 acres.

The history of mining in this section of Eastern Ontario has not been as successful as the richness of the ore deposits would warrant. It is carried on successfully, iron mining must be on a large scale. Heretofore, the parties working the properties carried on the business in a "hand to mouth" manner, simply taking out the best ore, shipping it, and on the money received carrying on the work until another shipment could be secured. This policy was detrimental to the progress of mining, but notwithstanding this poor way of mining the ore, there has been over 100,000 tons of ore shipped from the Wilbur properties, the new company, composed of a group of American capitalists, are prepared to work the mines on a scientific extensive scale to make it a profitable venture. They are equipping their properties with the very latest machinery, and will handle and treat their ore in the most scientific manner. From the very outset, they plan to ship 1,000 tons of ore daily, and inside six months they expect to increase this to 2,000 tons per day.

Previous to the taking over of these mines the American syndicate had exhaustive reports prepared by such well known authorities as Dr. Robert Bell, for many years the Canadian government geologist and one of the most widely recognized mining authorities in the world; by Professor R. Carr-Harris, late professor of engineering at the Royal Military College, Kingston, and engineer for the Quebec government, etc.; and a third report was made by J. G. McVilly, another well known mining engineer. The reports of the three were so uniformly favorable that the properties were purchased and at the present time extensive plans are being undertaken for their immediate development. The company will ship the ore by rail to Kingston, where it will be loaded on boats for shipment to Cleveland and other lake ports. Careful estimates show that this ore can be laid down at Cleveland at a much lower cost than the ore from the iron ranges in Wisconsin, Minnesota and Northern Michigan.

In addition to the cheapness with which the ore can be mined, treated and shipped, there are practically inexhaustible quantities. In one ore body in the Wilbur property there is over 4,300,000 tons of ore. This quantity is practically in sight. In addition, they estimate that on the balance of the Wilbur property investigated there is in the neighborhood of 40,000,000 tons. The other properties will largely increase this total, thus insuring that the supply of ore is almost unlimited.

Altogether, the decision of the Hawthorne Silver & Iron Mines, Limited, to develop the iron ore bodies in Eastern Ontario means that this part of the country will become one of the most important sections of Ontario.

The Very Latest Culled From All Over the World.

A late new pulp mill will be established at Newcastle, N.B.

Yveses are leaving Montreal empty on account of grainmen refusing to sell at the low prices offering in the British markets.

It is reported, at Washington, that legislation will be sought at the coming session of congress to place a prohibitive duty on power.

King Victor Emmanuel of Italy, and the Count of Turin narrowly escaped being struck by an aeroplane in flight on the aviation grounds at Milan.

Jessie Sweet, formerly of London, was committed to the police court for concealing the birth of a child, whose body was found in a value.

The U. S. steamboat inspectors have declared themselves unable to understand the cause of the wreck of the Pere Marquette car ferry on Lake Michigan.

On the grounds of ill-health a move is being made towards securing a pardon for George Eddy, Theresa, N. Y., convicted of the murder of John Reid at Palauki, N.Y., last December.

Miss Ethel McWhorter, London, Ont., leaves on Saturday for Vancouver, whence she will sail for Shanghai to take up missionary work. The Empress avenue Methodist church gave her a handbag and purse of gold.

Carrying petitions of a thousand names of sportsmen, a deputation waited on the Ontario government asking that they be allowed to take dogs from Eastern Ontario hunting in the north. Getting no satisfaction, they will appeal to the Dominion government.

WHAT HE SAW IN CANADA.

Struck by the Enormous Resources of the Country.

London, Sept. 28.—H. W. Just, secretary of the imperial conference, has returned from Canada, where during his stay of eight weeks he has traversed the continent from Montreal to Victoria and from Montreal to Halifax, thus, as he said, gaining a birdseye view of the dominion as a whole.

He was much impressed with the vastness, the resources, the enormous possibilities of the country, the buoyancy and the alertness of the population everywhere, and the great variety and picturesque scenery of the country. Everywhere he noticed the greatest keenness to exploit rapidly the national wealth of the dominion, whether agricultural or mineral, and to link together its various parts by improved means of communication in the west.

He was greatly struck with the progress, settlement, activity in trade and the rapidity with which provision is made in towns regarding public utilities, now largely owned and operated by the municipalities themselves, such as lighting, power, roadmaking, street car service, and the much-used telephone. He noticed an eager rivalry between the various centres of population.

Throughout the journey he observed a strong desire for more extended communication in trade with the mother country, and for greater participation on the part of British investors and British manufacturers in Canadian industrial development, hitherto too largely reserved to Americans, and for more frequent visits from Great Britain's representative men.

The Canadian government had greatly facilitated his tour by arranging that John Melb. Mowat, Kingston, should accompany him to the west.

Wedded at Niagara Falls.

Gananoque, Sept. 28.—At Niagara Falls, Ont., on Wednesday afternoon, September 21st, the marriage took place at Christ church, of Miss Edythe E. Mac, youngest daughter of Mrs. Thomas Berry, Gananoque, to Joseph Gilbert Courtenay, of Buffalo, son of Mr. and Mrs. J. J. Courtenay, of this town. Very Rev. Dean Stewart Houston officiated. The bride wore her travelling suit of gray with black satin trimmings, and large black beaver hat; also the groom's gift, a diamond set ring. She was unattended. After congratulations luncheon was served. Numerous and costly were the gifts received by the bride, among which was a handsome writing desk and chair from Christ church choir, also a silver butter dish and knife from the Y.P.C., the bride being a very active member of both. Mr. and Mrs. Courtenay left for Buffalo, where they will in future reside. Mr. Courtenay holding a very prominent position with the electrical plant of that city.
