THINGS THEATRICAL

SARA BERNHARDT'S VOICE LOSING ITS POWER.
 The Great French Actress is Not Arousing London—Martin Harvey Has Decided to Try the Music Halls.
 Sir Charles Wyndham will visit New York in January.
 "The Member from Ozark" is Augustus Thomas' latest.
 "Timon of Athens" is to be revived next week by Frederick Warde.
 Sir Herbert Tree is contemplating a revival of "A Midsummer Night's Dream."
 A new theatre exclusively for colored people will be opened shortly in Indianapolis.
 "Boots and Saddles," Eugene Walters' new play, is to have Ida Conquest for leading lady.
 "Madame Troubadour," the new Shubert musical comedy, is unique in that it has no chorus.
 Miss Elsie Janis is still in Chicago with the George Ade-Blossom combination, "The Slim Princess."
 "The Iron King," Cassino Hamilton's new play, deals with the industrial world, and its scenes are laid near Pittsburg.
 Madge Lessing, the former Broadway favorite, is delighting the hearts of Berlin with "Kings On My Fingers," done in Dutch.
 Olin Skinner will star later in the season in "Siri," by M. Henri Lavedan, a drama inspired by the story of the lost Dauphin.
 "The Chocolate Soldier," that clever adaptation of Bernard Shaw's "Arms and the Man," is being given in vaudeville in New York, with Thomas Terrell in the cast.
 Richard Strauss will soon present his "Rose Cavalier" in Dresden. It is said to enter to the popular craze for the Viennese operetta waltz melody.
 Martin Harvey, disgusted with his failure to make any money in Shakespearean repertoire in the English provinces, is going to make a plunge in the music halls.
 Ellen Terry will arrive in New York October 29th for her farewell tour of America in a series of Shakespearean recitals, to be given in Elizabethan costume.
 The London audience boomed "D'Arcy of the Guards," formerly produced by Henry Miller, when given at the St. James this week with George Alexander as the hero.
 Margaret Anglin will appear as an exponent of "Woman's Rights" in her new play, "The Backsliders," which was written by a woman under the nom de plume of George Egerton.
 Mary Manning, who underwent an operation for appendicitis recently, is improving rapidly and her physicians believe she will be ready to take up active work again within the next two weeks.
 According to cables from Rome, Puccini, the noted composer, is considerably nervous over his forthcoming visit to New York, at which time his new opera, based on "The Girl of the Golden West," is to be produced. It has been learned that Mme. Destini, Caruso and Amato are to interpret the leading roles when the opera is presented.
 Mme. Sara Bernhardt has opened at the Coliseum, in London, Eng., with a one-act version of "L'Aiglon," supported by a company of players from her own theatre in Paris; but she has not created the sensation that her manager anticipated. Madame is beginning to show her age and her voice is far from what it used to be, having lost much of its resonance and carrying power.
 The only theatre in the world that had no deadheads, and which "sells out" at every performance, is open but five months every ten years, and perhaps that is the reason for both these conditions. The Passion Play, theatre at Oberammergau is the theatre referred to, and as its capacity at the established price is \$7,000 in round numbers, it is easy to figure total receipts from \$250,000 to \$350,000 for the performances that vary in number from forty to fifty.
 "Yaohai," Mascagni's new opera, in which Miss Bessie Abbot is to star in America, has been finished. The first performance will be given in the New Theatre, New York, November 21st. Signor Mascagni is now in Rome, where he is packing up for his trip to America. The score of the opera is in the hands of copyists, and parts will

be ready by the end of the month. Miss Abbott will sail from Cleburne for New York on October 19th. The other principals, artists, chorus, scenery and costumes will leave Genoa October 13th.
 It is reported in London that Mrs. William E. Corey, formerly Mabel Gilman, the actress, is to give the Shakespeare Memorial Fund theatre ten thousand dollars. It is said that Mrs. Corey was interested in the project through the Hon. Mrs. Alfred Littleton. Some time ago Mrs. Corey announced a desire to return to the stage, and this may have a bearing on her attitude. The idea of the project is much like that of the New Theatre, New York. Mrs. Corey is now in London, where she has been taking lessons in diction and elocution from Miss Rosina Filippi.
 Every London theatre has a royal box with a private entrance, and as soon as a new theatre was built in recent years King Edward's coachman would visit it to ascertain the best way of approaching the royal entrance.

In "The House Next Door," at the Grand, George Ashton, who is called the K.O.E.O., or "King's Own Entertainment Officer," arranges for the king's visit to the theatre and for all entertainments of like character for the royal family. Mr. Ashton is at hand to see that all arrangements are completed for the king's visit, and the manager of the theatre also meets royalty at the private entrance. Every royal box has an anteroom furnished as a drawing-room, where the royal party lounge and have refreshments during the intervals. When the London Coliseum was built an ingenious little railway with one or two cars was constructed from the royal entrance to the royal box. When King Edward visited the Coliseum for the first time he looked at the little railway with an amused smile, but declined to journey on it. The rails were promptly removed after the royal visit.
 Exchange of Royal Banners.
 The arrangement of the Royal banners in the choir of St. George's chapel, Windsor, which is customary after the demise of the crown, is shortly to be carried out, says the London Chronicle, by Garter King of Arms, Black Rod, the chancellor and secretary and other officials of the order. King Edward's banner and other emblems will be removed to St. George's Hall, in the castle, and replaced by those of King George. The latter are to be hung over the sovereign's stall, which is to the right of the entrance to the choir from the nave and immediately under the organ screen.
