San Salvador, Oct. 12.-The comnander of the United States cruises Princeton, to-day, demanded the surrender of General Jos Maria Valladdras, governor of Amalpa, Honduras and the commandant of the Honduras fort forthwith. The commandant de fied the Princeton and sent word to the Princeton he would fight to the death before giving up. It is reported a detachment of marines will be landed from the Princeton, seize Valladdrass of his anti-foreign followers. It was also said feeling was so high that a love on the part of the Princeton would result in open hostilities which would necessitate the occupying of the republic by American soldiers.
