**SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST LAND REGULATIONS.**

ANY PERSON WHO IS THE SOLE head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency, on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister.

**Qualifications.**—The homesteader must be a resident of the Dominion of Canada, and must be at least 18 years of age, and must be a citizen of the Dominion of Canada, or have the right to become a citizen.

**Application.**—The homesteader must file a declaration of intention to settle on the land in each of the six years from the date of his application, and must cultivate 40 acres of the land in each of the six years.

**Home.**—The homesteader must have a house on the land, and must have a house on the land in each of the six years.

**Water.**—The homesteader must have a well on the land, and must have a well on the land in each of the six years.

**Stocks.**—The homesteader must have a certain number of head of stock on the land, and must have a certain number of head of stock on the land in each of the six years.

## TWO TYPHOID DEATHS

OF TWO FORMER RESIDENTS OF NAPANEE.

Rev. Adelbert Hays Died in Saskatchewan—The Late Hugh Killorn—Peter Fraser, of Simcoe, Passed Away Wednesday.

Napanee, Oct. 14.—A telegram was received from Carleton Place, on Wednesday, announcing the death of Rev. Adelbert Hays, son of William Hays, Thomas street. Deceased contracted typhoid fever a couple of weeks ago, and not being very robust, could not withstand the disease. The remains were interred at Medicine Hat. Deceased was thirty-eight years of age and leaves a wife, two sons and one daughter.

Another death from typhoid fever was that of Hugh Killorn, son of James Killorn, Napanee, who died at Grand Rapids, Minnesota, on Sunday last. The remains were brought to Napanee and the funeral took place Thursday morning, from his father's residence, Thomas street, to St. Patrick's church, thence to the Roman Catholic vault. The deceased was thirty-three years of age, and was well-known in Napanee. He spent last winter with his parents here.
