Before having the views shown on the canvases Dr. Hare gave a short address, dealing with the fishermen and their work. He referred to the business relations between the fishermen and the trader. He pointed out that it was a sort of gamble with the trader in doing business with the fishermen, and for this reason, when the fishermen had a poor season in catching fish, he was anxious to pay the trader for his provisions.

The speaker referred to the noble service rendered by the dogs, for travelling. "Life in that country would be impossible without the dogs," he said. At present, they had a better class of dogs, and they were increasing in number.

The views shown, included pictures of the dogs on the trail, the hospital, homes of the people, and some of the fishermen. A picture was shown of "Jimmy Jack," a warm friend, and "Sam," the doctor's driver, and the doctor had some very interesting stories to tell of both.

Dr. Hare emphasized the fact that a person could not live in this district from what they could derive off the land; they had to depend upon what they could take out with them. In the summer, they could live on the trout they caught. In summer, one could travel by canoe. There was good water power, but nothing for which it could be developed.

At the close of Dr. Hare's address, Dr. M. Macdonnell made a few remarks, thanking Dr. Hare, and his wife, and gave him a message to deliver to Dr. Grenfell, to the effect that Kingston people wished to convey greetings to him, and at the same time wished to express their sympathy and support in his work.

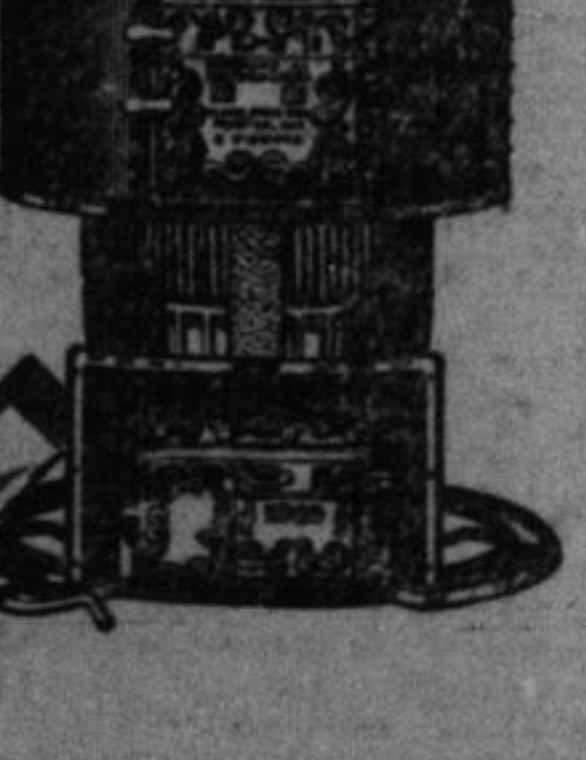
