

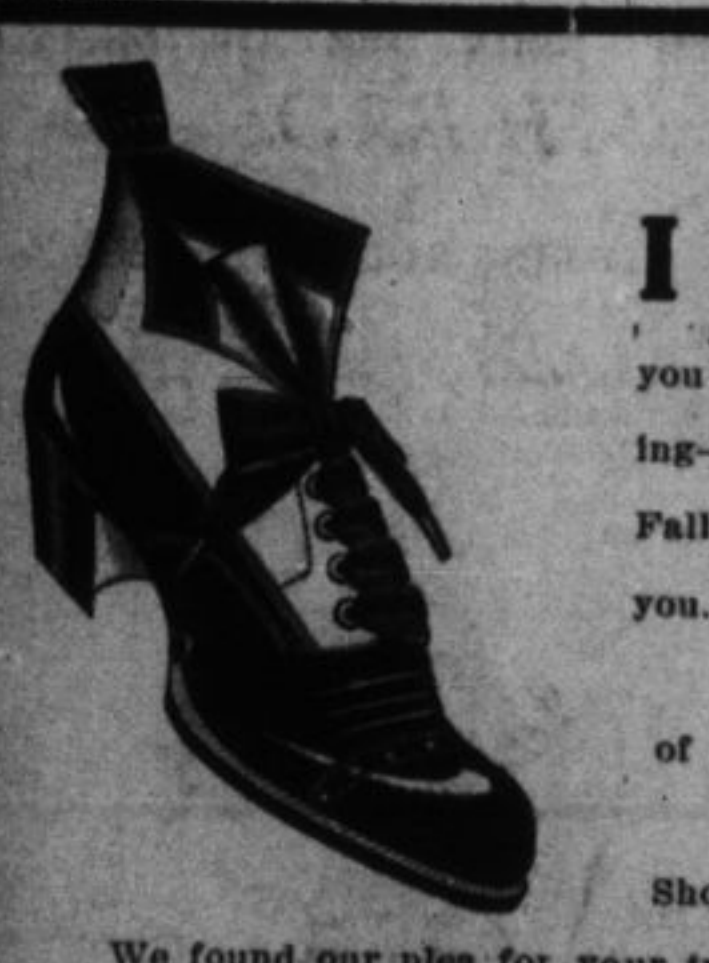

FIVE YEARS MORE

SYNDICATE CONTROL WILL BE CONTINUED.

Thousand Island Park Directors Renew Agreement for Period of Five Years at Meeting Held in Watertown—Syndicate Man Re-elected President.

By an agreement reached among the directors of the Thousand Island Park Association the "syndicate" agreement by which the island resort has been governed for years will continue for five years more.

The Thousand Island Park Association is capitalized at \$50,000 and has entire control over the park. The company originally purchased 1,000 acres of land on Wolfe Island, which has since, by sale, been reduced to 750 acres, on which the park is located.

There have been reports of discussion among the stockholders, and it is admitted that there is a certain element which is desirous of turning the park into an amusement resort.

It was decided also to make a number of improvements about the park. A new engine and boiler and power plant will be installed, and the lease of the Columbian Hotel to Levi A. Johnson of this city was extended for five years.

Officers were elected, no changes being made in the list as it existed last year. As follows: President, George C. Sawyer, Syracuse; first vice-president, J. P. Lewis, Beaver Falls; second vice-president, R. P. Grant, Clayton; treasurer, W. E. Fitch, Lowellville; assistant treasurer, E. R. Redburn, Fulton; secretary, K. W. Goodale, of this city.

According to the report of the treasurer the receipts for last season were \$24,790.20, while the disbursements were \$19,586.07.
