
DREW CARNEGIE.

The endowment increased to-day is his the \$10,000,000 foundation for the dvancement of teaching, made in 905 and increased to \$15,000,000 the Carnegie Institute in Pittsburg and the \$12,000,00% fund for reesta's ishment of the Carnegie Institute in Washington, Mr. Caenegie's gift to libraries during the past twenty years are estimated at \$35,000,000 for the United States and \$17,000,000 abroad. Toronto, Dec. 15.-Col. James Mason, chairman, and R. S. Neville, secretary, of the executive committee of the centennial celebration, have in vited Mayor Geary to attend the meeting to be held in the city-hall on Friday afternoon to complete arrangements with their project. They aim to invite King George to

Canada in 1912, or one or two years later, for a national celebration of the successful defence of Canada in 1812-14. They would erect a monument to celebrate it and would hold a great pageant also. They suggest that if the United States wishes to do anything definite in the matter of a celebration of 100 years of peace at the same time, it should make perpetual the Rush-Bagot convention, which prohibits armaments on the great akes. This convention is now terminable by either Canada or the United States on six months' notice.


