Serious Fire in Chicago.

Chicago, Dec. 22 .- At the very me ment that the news reached here the fearful loss of life at the fire Philadelphia, twenty Chicago firemen including Chief Fire Marshal James Horan, Assistant Chief William Bur rows and Lient, Fitzgerald, were bur ied and killed under a heavy meta canopy in the Morris and Company meat warehouse, Laion stock yards which collapsed during a balf million dollar fire beneath it. The fire was caused by the bursting of an am monia pipe.

The scene which followed the crash was heart-rendering. Thousands of the late head of the Christian Science gallons of water had already been thrown into the burning building and there were at least two feet of icy wa ter in the cellar.

The first two bodies to be taker from the debris were those of Patrick Carroll and George MacHinsky, Their heads were crushed almost beyond recognition. A few moments later the body of Charles Erderman was pulled from beneath a heavy girder, and John Carroll's body was taken out shortly afterward. Erderman's facwas buried in a mass of ice and Joke Carroll was frozen stiff. A hurry cal was sent out to all nearby hospitals and ambulances were soon at the scene. The fire is still raging.
