CARRYING THE BY-LAWS. The people were most considerate of the by-laws which were referred to them in the municipal election.

There was really no reason to reject the proposal to borrow \$12,000 with which to replace some of the street lamps and provide the cost of some power-house machinery or equipment.

The extension of Barrie street was in doubt, and because so many of the qualified voters spoke indifferently with regard to it.

By-laws involving additions to the public debt are not popular things. So many have been rejected, here and elsewhere, that the experience of yesterday can be contemplated with considerable satisfaction.

THE SCHOOL ELECTIONS.

The people must be pretty well satisfied with the manner in which the school trustees have carried themselves, or all of whom who offered for re-election would not have been returned.

THE MAYORALTY CONTEST.

Mr. Graham was elected in the majority contest, and by a substantial majority. It is the unexpected that sometimes happens, and it is the unexpected that occurred in connection with this election.

The causes for this change need not be canvassed here. Some electors evidently felt that long service should be recognized. The working classes, too, supported Mr. Graham, for his larger support came from the outlying districts, and in the electoral divisions in which so many of the workmen reside.

The Whig regrets the defeat of Mr. McKay. He is a man of pronounced ability. He has given evidence of this in the manner in which he has built up and extended his own business. He represented those who have felt that if the city did not boom it was perhaps because the representative men did not exhibit the progressive spirit and did not apply themselves industrially to the solution of public problems.

CHOICE OF THE PEOPLE.

Some surprises followed the counting of the ballots so far as the aldermanic elections were concerned. The storm centres were St. Lawrence and Victoria wards. In the one the chief objection to the return of Ald. Elliott lay in the fact that he had opposed the paving of Princess street, including the portion occupied by the street railway, and the relaying of the tracks in concrete at the city's expense.

After congratulations were extended the party adjourned to the dining-room where the decorations were in pink and green. Lovely pink carnations adorned the glittering tables and an elaborate supper was enjoyed. The toast to the bride was proposed by George H. Hunter in an eloquent address and was graciously responded to by the groom.

In Victoria ward Mr. Chown was defeated and the city will miss him in its councils, but as a financier he stood high. For he would have been the better in the contest without the attacks which were made by his friends upon Mr. Shaw, for he is an able and experienced man, and one who can bring to the consideration of Kingston's affairs many helpful suggestions.

Three ex-mayors, (including the member-elect for St. Lawrence ward), returned to the council to give it the benefit of their training. In Rideau ward Mr. Couper has certainly been a devoted servant of the people and deserves well of them.

BOTH BY-LAWS PASSED.

The People Voted for Both the Money Measures. Both by laws voted upon by the people, on Monday were carried. The one for the issue of \$13,000 in debentures for street lighting received a majority of 809, while that for the extension of Barrie street was carried by 307. The votes were:

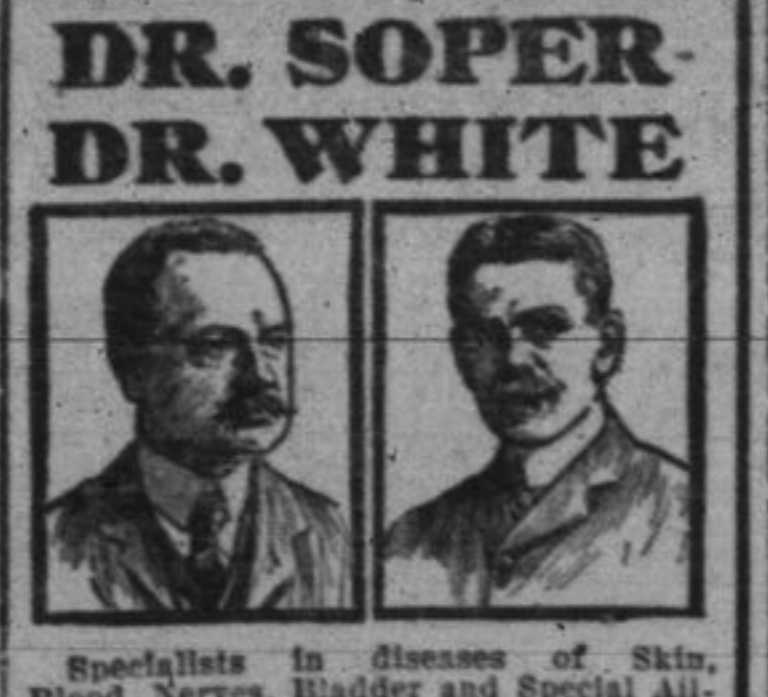
