FOUND DEAD IN HOME

LATE MISS HANNAH FRASER,
OF ERNESTTOWN.

David Richardson, Formerly of
Napanee, Dropped Dead in
Watertown, N.Y.—The Late Mrs.
W. H. Perry, of Toronto.

Napanee, Jan. 3.—Word was received, yesterday morning, that Hannah Fraser, of Ernesttown, was found by her relatives dead in her home. Deceased lived alone, on the farm, and the cause of death was heart disease. Deceased leaves two sisters, Mrs. J. D. Miller, of Swartzville, and Mrs. W. Cliff, of Carlton Place. She was a daughter of the late Allen Fraser, of Ernesttown, and lived on the homestead with her sister, who died a couple of years ago. The funeral will take place on Thursday.

David Richardson, formerly of Napanee, now of Watertown, N.Y., dropped dead, yesterday morning, in Watertown. Deceased was forty-nine years of age. He leaves three brothers, Reuben, James B., and Benjamin, Sr., of Napanee. The remains will be brought to Napanee for interment.

Another of the old residents, in the person of George Leamy, was called to his long home on Monday, at the age of seventy-six years. For some years he had been a sufferer from rheumatism. He leaves, besides his wife, two daughters, Mary and Josephine, at home, and one son, George, in South Africa. The funeral will take place on Wednesday morning to St. Patrick's church, thence to the Roman Catholic vault.

The many friends of Mrs. W. H. Perry, of Toronto, will be pained to hear of her sudden death on Friday last at her home, 370 St. James Square, Toronto. No particulars of her death were received. She leaves, besides her sorrowing husband, two young daughters, Ethel and Catherine. Mrs. Perry had many friends in Napanee, where she resided before removing to Toronto a few years ago.

Prime heifers sold at 53c. to 6c. per lb.; pretty good animals, 4c. to 5c., and the common stock, 3c. to 4c. per lb. Calves sold at from 4c. to 5c. per lb.
