City Council Has the Matter Before It—May Ask a Change in the Municipal Assessment Act. The following table shows the exempted property in Kingston. MILLIONAIRE'S DOMESTIC WOE. Cuts Off Widow and Children With Dollar Each.

New York, Jan. 21.—A despatch to the Tribune from Richmond, Va., says the body of a man found dead yesterday at the door of a Richmond hotel, was identified to-day as that of Eno Whytehall, a Scotchman, millionaire owner of stocks in the street railways of Hamburg, Germany, philanthropist and traveller. He came to Richmond from New York on Monday. Death resulted from a sudden physical collapse.

An examination of Mr. Whytehall's effects revealed a will, telling a story of an unhappy domestic life. He married twenty-five years ago, and had three children, two of whom survive him. He and his family disagreed fifteen years ago, and he exiled himself. The will says: "With my own hand, free will and special choice, I do hereby most emphatically disinherit and cut off my wife, Sophie F., and my two children, namely, my son, Benjamin B., and my daughter, Maud S., with \$1 each, and \$1 only."

PASTORS TIRE OF BEGGING. Not to Ask for a Cent for One Year.

Atlanta, Ga., Jan. 21.—The preachers of Atlanta have adopted the following resolution: "Whereas the preachers of Atlanta have been brought to largely tax gatherers, spending their time running down people to get money out of them, and whereas this is getting to be such a burden as to be detrimental to the main work of the ministry, that of saving souls; resolved, that we, the preachers of Atlanta, pledge ourselves that for the year 1911 we will not take upon ourselves the collection of money from our congregations."
