# FATHER VAUGHAN AND THE CHURCH

He Thinks England Would be More Patriotic with Priests to Guide the Peope

Father Vaughan, the famous Roman Catholic preacher in London, says the people of England are not patriotic enough, and that this again is the result of the country not having a great body of Catholic priests to teach them. He told all these things, not to his usual English congregation, but in a sermon in a German church in London the other day. Germany, he said, was the most patriotic land in all Europe, and its Catholic population was the most patriotic party in the empire. And if the great Central party in Germany was the recognized patriotic party, in the best sense of the word the reason of it, he continued, was not far to seek. Patriotism was the outcome of religion, and in the measure in which religion was cultvated true patriotism flourished. When he heard of so-called Catholic countries falling away from religion he knew that the priesthood was shirking its duties. It was the house-to-house going priest who made the church-going people. He had never known, at home or abroad, any local painstaking, apostolic-living clergy without a churchgoing and religious-practising congregation.
