

The above is a picture of the toll house and gute on the Kingston-Storrington road, a short distance beyond Kingston Junction. It is one of the two last remaining toll gates leading to the city. Two months ago, the county council purchased the last toll road in Frontenac from the Kingston and Storrington Road company, of which W. J. 
