ANOTHER LAW SUIT
ATTACHMENT ON BUILDING BEQUEATHED TO BOWMANVILLE.

Say Transfer Invalid—Trust Company of Canada Invokes the Law of the District.
Bowmanville, Ont., Feb. 7.—Information has reached town authorities here from Washington, D.C., that an attachment for \$191,045, said to be due the Royal Trust company of Canada on a judgment secured in Canada against Charles McGill, brother of the late James H. McGill, was placed on January 31st, on the McGill street building at 908 G street northwest.

The judgment was procured by the trust company in its capacity as liquidator of the Ontario Bank of Toronto, which failed in 1906. Charles McGill held 2,008 shares of the bank's stock, on which he was found to be liable under the Canada law to pay ninety-five per cent. of the par value of the stock, amounting to \$190,769, which, with the costs, amounts to \$191,045.

Charles McGill transferred his interest in the McGill building to his daughter, Isabel M. McGill, in 1909. Recently she and her uncle, John McGill, brought suit in the district supreme court to set aside the devise of the building by McGill's will to the town of Bowmanville, Canada.

Attorneys Herbert and Micou and A. H. Ferguson, who represent the Royal Trust company, claim that the transfer to the daughter is invalid under the law, which forbids an alien to purchase real estate in the district. Miss McGill being a citizen of Canada the attachment is to hold against the half interest of Charles McGill in the event of the suit against the Canadian town being successful.

LUNATIC'S STRANGE DIET.
Viennese Patient Swallowed Four Pounds of Spoons.
Vienna, Feb. 7.—A surgical operation by which two and three-quarter pounds of metal were taken from the patient, was performed here at the Franz Joseph hospital, by Prof. Lotheissen, upon a man of forty years, named Tacha. He had been confined in a public lunatic asylum, where, about three months ago, he secretly abstracted about four-teen iron spoons and swallowed them. This strange nourishment at first caused him no annoyance. The spoons were missed, but nobody suspected their whereabouts.

Although Tacha has sound lungs, he began spitting blood some days ago, and was cross-questioned, until at last he confessed that he had swallowed the iron spoons. He was taken to the hospital, and an application of the Roentgen rays soon showed the truth of his assertion. An operation was unavoidable, and the three surgeons who carried it through were completely successful. A small opening was made in the stomach, and one by one the large spoons were extracted. They weighed altogether two and three-quarter pounds. The patient's condition is satisfactory, and he will soon be able to be discharged from the hospital.

SPECTACULAR FLIGHT.
Canadian Aviator Again Delights Cubans With His Progress.
Havana, Feb. 6.—With practically the entire population of Havana looking on, J. A. D. McDurdy, who recently crossed the Straits of Florida in a biplane, yesterday made a magnificent aerial flight, starting from the drill grounds at Camp Columbia to Morro lighthouse, which he circled twice and returned. The official time of the round trip was sixteen minutes and twenty seconds. The estimated distance was eleven miles.

A great reception was accorded McDurdy last evening at the Alhambra theatre. Vice-President Alfredo Zayas presided and presented McDurdy with the purse of \$5,000 given by the Havana Post for his flight from Key West to Havana.

A Brute of a Husband.
Montreal, Feb. 7.—Striking his sixteen-year-old wife with his fists, and kicking her, thereby causing the death of her unborn child, and leaving the mother in a precarious condition, are allegations against William Gervais, 49 St. Timothee street, who is now behind police station bars. In addition Gervais is accused of having assaulted Constable Maisonneuve and of having almost chewed the policeman's ear off during a fight on Craig street last August. These various charges against him culminated in the accused's arrest.

Glengarrigians' Generosity.
Cornwall, Feb. 7.—At the annual meeting of the Presbyterian church, Alexandria, the pastor, Rev. D. Stewart, said that he thought the time was opportune to consider the building of a new church. To the surprise and delight of all, Hugh Mann announced that he and his wife, John McIntosh, would double the voluntary subscriptions of members and adherents towards erecting a new church. A meeting will be held on February 15th, to further consider the project.

Received No Chinese Aid.
Vancouver, B.C., Feb. 7.—The Chinese commission session here has ended. George Macdonald testified that no party funds had ever been accorded to the liberal executive here from Chinese sources. Under cross-examination by counsel for Yip On, Mr. Macdonald said that the liberal party in this city had no funds at all, and had, in fact, been in debt for four or five years. The commission will hear evidence at Victoria to-day.

Sentenced for White Slavery.
New York, Feb. 7.—The first sentence under the new "White Slave" law passed by the last legislature was passed by Judge Malone. The judge sent Samuel Rubin to serve not less than ten years or more than seventeen years and six months in Sing Sing.

Washington, Feb. 6.—It is understood that during the recent visit of former Vice-President Fairbanks, when he was a house guest of President Taft, he was offered the post of special ambassador to the coronation of King George, next June. The appointment will probably not be announced until the close of congress.

Mr. Fairbanks will be accompanied by a secretary, and also an attaché from the army and from the navy. He will be conveyed to and from England on a battleship. It is said the North Dakota has been designated for that purpose. The convoy of the battleship will be composed of at least two armored cruisers.

HE IS A SICK MAN.
Throat Trouble is Giving Medical Advisers Anxiety.

London, Feb. 7.—Lloyd-George's friends are somewhat uneasy as to the state of his health. That the throat trouble from which the chancellor of the exchequer has been suffering is still a matter of no little anxiety to his medical advisers is shown by the fact that he has been imperatively ordered to return to the south of France in spite of the obvious inconvenience that must be caused by his absence while the business of the session is in course of arrangement.

It is by no means improbable that his period of recuperation may have to be still further extended, and in any case it will be necessary for him to husband his strength as much as possible in the immediate future and to refrain altogether from platform oratory for some time to come lest his vocal cords should become permanently affected.

In view of his tremendous activity during the last eighteen months there has been a tendency to forget the fact that Lloyd-George is physically by no means a strong man, and the excitement and emotional intensity which have so stirring an effect upon popular audiences are necessarily wearing to a man of the chancellor's rather slight and fragile physique, apart from the strain which his office has imposed upon him. He is now warned that he must spare himself as much as possible for some time to come if he would escape the danger of a complete and serious breakdown.

DIVERSION OF TRADE
Will Follow Reciprocity — What Austen Chamberlain Says.

London, Feb. 6.—Speaking at the Birmingham Jewellers' dinner, Austen Chamberlain, M.P., dwelt upon the American-Canadian reciprocity agreement. He said: "I believe the agreement will have the greatest effect in commercial history since the foundation of the German Zollverein. If it is ratified, I fear there will be a great diversion of trade that has hitherto been carried on from east to west, west to east, north to south and south to north. Food products which have found their way to us will find a competitive and nearer market in the United States. Fear prices which have been kept low for us by the bountiful Canadian harvest may be increased by the American demand for Canadian corn. There is also danger the agreement will mean a great stimulus to American trade in Canada, to the detriment alike of Canadian and British manufacturers. It will not only deprive us of the advantages which Canadian imperial patriotism has hitherto afforded us, but will also expose us to a new and more eager competition from the United States. It must increase enormously America's power in the world's export trade, as well as strengthen her in regard to domestic competition." The speaker ended by maintaining that the ratification of the agreement would only render imperial preference more urgent and necessary.

GAVE HIMSELF UP.
Haunted by Years—Alleged Slayer Surrenders.

New York, Feb. 7.—Haunted by the memories of a crime committed twelve years ago, a man who said he was King McNamara, formerly of Lexington, Ky., surrendered to the police of the West 30th street station. He said he had killed a man in Lexington and that a reward of \$10,000 had been offered for his arrest.

McNamara was taken to police headquarters and a telegram was sent to Lexington. A reply was received from Chief of Police Regan reading: "King McNamara wanted here for slaying Jacob S. Keller in February, 1899. Hold. Will send man."

McNamara was questioned by the police as to the details of his crime but refused to talk about it. He said that he had travelled all over the United States in the past twelve years but although he had eluded pursuers he could not get away from his own conscience. He had stood it as long as he could and now is ready to go back to Lexington to face the charge.

LARGE SIDEWHEELER.
City of Detroit Will Cost Over Million.

Detroit, Mich., Feb. 7.—A new passenger steamer, to be the largest side-wheeler on fresh water, and costing between a million and a million and a half dollars, is to be built for the Detroit and Cleveland Navigation company, and is expected to be contracted for within a few days to the Great Lakes Engineering Works. The new boat will be 470 feet over all, and breadth over guards of ninety-three feet. Both the stern rudders and wireless equipment will be of steel construction throughout. The new boat will be named the City of Detroit, and will go on the Cleveland and Detroit run.

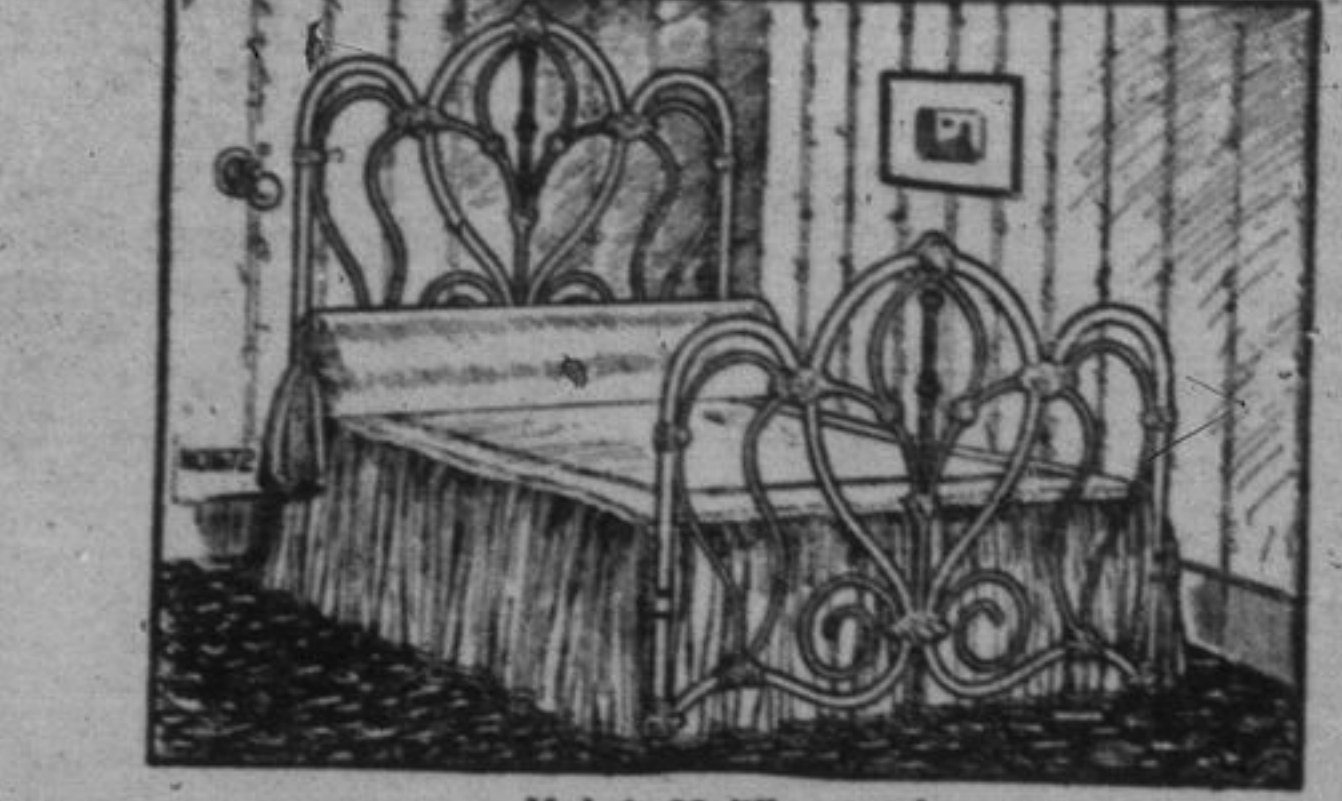
WROTE NAME ON EGG.
