The Predominating Issue.

The matter of the House of Lords will predominate over. all other projects, as home rule and disestablishment cannot be taken up at once. The government's immediate policy for dealing with the lords is embodied in what is termed the parliament bill. it practically wipes out the power of the upper chamber to kill legislation in the commons by providing that any pill shall become law which the comnons has sent to the lords for three successive sessions, in a period of time not less than two years, and which has been three times rejected or not lisposed of. To insure the control of finance by the commons and settle the issue which the lords raised when they rejected the Lloyd-George budget the sill provides that any money bill which the upper chamber does not bass within one month after it is sent ip from the lower house shall, with the royal assent, become law. The speaker of the commons is given final authority to decide whether any measure deals with taxation, applications and loans; and is properly a money bill. The last and not the least important provision reduces the life of a parliament from seven years to five.
