TOOK SEVEN WIVES

A ST. THOMAS MAN BEING SOUGHT BY POLICE.

His First Wife Was a Brantford Girl—He Spent All Her Money and She Left Him.

Los Angeles, Cal., Feb. 17.—The authorities in Canada and the United States are looking for Bertram S. de la Meutre, alias Bertram Smith, soldier of fortune, traveller and linguist, who is now a fugitive from justice, charged with wholesale bigamy.

Smith has, according to the local authorities, at least seven wives living. Their names and addresses are as follows, according to the officers: No. 1, Mrs. Lucy S. Smith, of St. Thomas, Ont.; No. 2, Frances Downs, of Atlanta, Ga.; No. 3, Blanche Hall, of Bryan, Texas; Nos. 4 and 5, residents of Cuba; No. 6, Miss Muller, of Hollywood; and No. 7, Mrs. Charlotte Ponder, of the Hotel Burlington, Ninth and Burlington streets, Los Angeles, who became Mrs. Herbert Smith on January 8th in San Francisco.

It is believed that Smith has other wives living in the United States and in Europe, but the police have received no information concerning their identity. Two of the women who admit that they have been married to Smith have indicated their willingness to become witnesses against him in the event that he is taken into custody.

Four others have notified the officers that they do not desire to press a prosecution against him.

Has Wife in St. Thomas. St. Thomas, Ont., Feb. 17.—Herbert Smith was born in St. Thomas, forty years ago, of well-to-do parents. His father died, leaving him considerable money. His mother married again, and still lives here. Herbert Smith was well educated, and married a wealthy girl in Brantford, twenty years ago. He spent all her money and spoiled her life. She left him eight years ago, when they were living in St. Louis, Mo. She came to St. Thomas, and lives here with his mother, and is known as Mrs. Lucy S. Smith. Herbert Smith is a lecturer by occupation, and when last heard from by his friends here was in New Orleans. After Smith's marriage in Brantford he was tried for bigamy before Judge Hardy, but was acquitted.
