A GARBAGE SYSTEM

HAS FINALLY BEEN ADOPTED FOR KINGSTON.

It Will Cost the City Only \$1,000 a Year Out of General Taxation—Ald. Toye the Father of the Garbage Plan.

Kingston is at last to have a system of garbage collection. The scheme recommended by the special committee appointed to consider the matter was adopted last evening by the city council, and as the result of it Ald. Toye has had another feather added to his cap.

Of course, that will be if the system is a success, but Ald. Toye declares it will be and if the result of his past work for the city is any criterion the scheme will be a success.

That the city solicitor be instructed to prepare a by-law for a garbage system, and an agreement between the corporation of the city of Kingston and Thomas Nicholson and Smith Elliott, agreeing to remove all garbage from the premises of all citizens...

Ald. Toye said that he considered that Kingston was getting a pretty cheap garbage system when it was paying only \$1,000 out of the general taxes for it; the cost on the average was only thirty-eight cents a year for each householder.

Ald. Elliott thought the garbage committee should be congratulated for the manner in which it had handled the matter. It was legislative in the interest of the masses and he was going to support its recommendations.

The report was carried and afterwards Ald. Toye submitted a by-law for the establishment of the system, which is to be under the direction of the medical health officer. If more than two collections a week are required at various seasons the health officer shall have power to order extra collections.

The by-law does not prevent others than the city contractor collecting garbage but it provides that those who collect it must conform to the rules laid down by the board of health, under whose direction they will be.
