ALD. ELLIOTT TELLS WAS POLICE CHIEF

WHY HE IS NOT NOW SO ENTHUSIASTIC Over the Hydro-Electric Proposition—He is Tired of Waiting—Commission Has Failed to Answer the East's Request.

Ald. R. F. Elliott, chairman of the civic light, heat and power committee, denies the statement of the Toronto World to-day that corporation influences are at work in Kingston spreading distrust of Hon. Adam Beck's pledges to give cheap power to Eastern Ontario.
