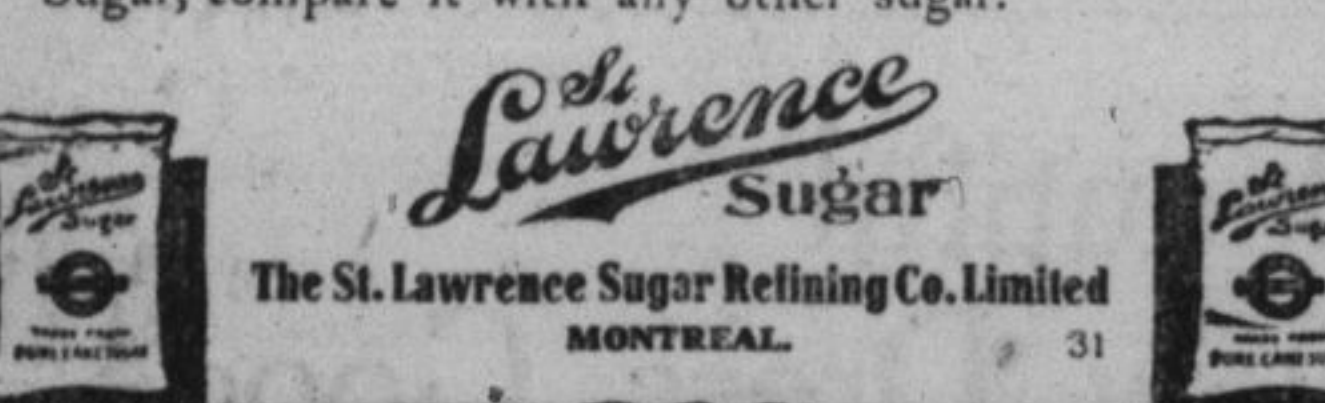

TO LOSE FORTUNES BIBLE SAVED LIFE

UNDER BANKER'S WILL CHILDREN MUST REMAIN JEWS. OF A SOLDIER DURING CIVIL WAR.

Must Not Wed Gentiles—Daughters to Lose Three-fourths if They Aid Liberal-Judaism Movement.

London, March 7.—The will of the late Lord Waything, the well-known banker, has been sworn for probate at 1,500,000 pounds sterling. So far as can be ascertained at present the estate is probably worth more.

All bequests to the testator's children, or those inheriting through the children, are subject to a clause providing that at his death they must be professing the Jewish religion, and must not be married to persons not professing it. It lays a solemn injunction on the children against abandoning the Jewish religion or inter-marrying outside of it at any time or under any circumstances. The trustees are empowered to withhold three-fourths of their inheritance from two daughters who have a assisted the liberal Judaism movement, if, after his death, they assist it directly or indirectly.

GAME WAS A ROUT.

Receipts Were \$1,074.

There were exactly 1,896 paid admissions at the game last night. The receipts were \$1,074, the largest amount ever taken in at a hockey game here. Fully 800 people were turned away. Each team and the O.H.A. get \$275.

Varsity Disgusts Montreal.

Much dissatisfaction was expressed on all sides with the unsportsmanlike manner in which Varsity had acted, while the plea put forward by the R.M.C. that the authorities would not allow them to compete, was more generally accepted. It appears that Varsity were unable to give any reasonable excuse for their withdrawal except that they should not postpone their own meet, and were fearful of certain defeat at the hands of Queen's, as happened, last year.

Verona Beat Sydenham.

Verona, March 6.—On Saturday, March 4th, a large crowd of spectators watched the speedy locals defeat Sydenham's host septette in an exciting game of hockey by a score of 2 to 1.

The locals surprised the crowd as this is the first time that Sydenham have been defeated by any country team. The game was clean and manly from start to finish, both teams playing excellent combination, but only on account of the sure work of Verona's defence, was the visiting team held at bay. At half time no goals were yet scored by either side, but shortly after the beginning of the second half, Boyce scored Sydenham's only goal which was soon counter-balanced by Verona's fast little forward, "Ken" Trousdale. At full time the score was even and after playing twenty minutes overtime Skinner, of Verona, scored the winning goal. Russell Stoney, of Woodstock, proved himself an efficient referee.

He had for forty-three years been one of that town's most useful citizens. Alexander Fraser, Belleville, died on Friday.

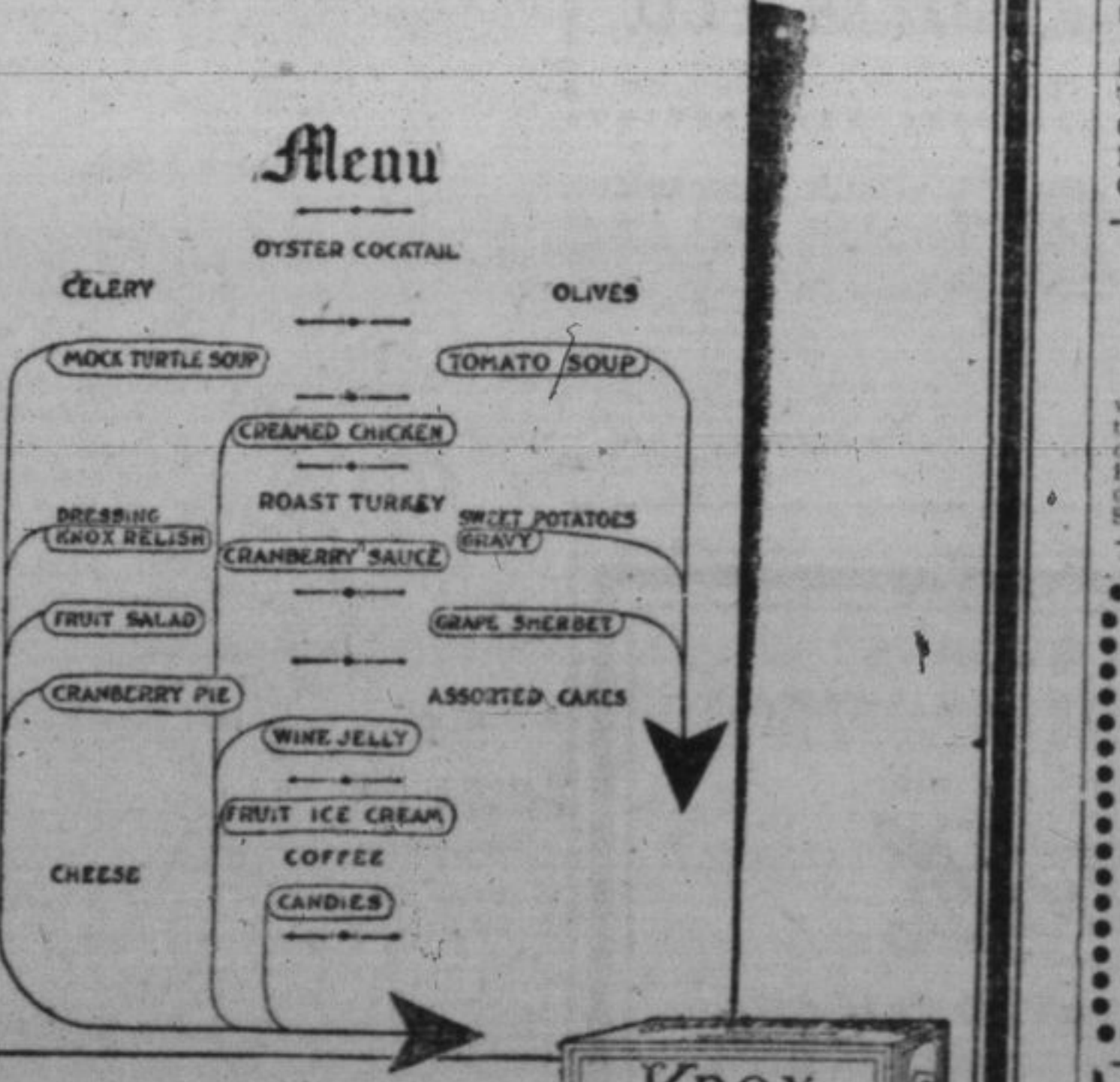
