Bremen, March 15.—The annual re-

port of the North German Lloyd Steamship Co. for 1910 shows gross profits of \$8,150,600 marks (\$9,537,650), as compared with \$2,99,600 marks for the previous year.

written off was \$20,439,500 marks, against \$20,032,000.
