PRAYED ALL NIGHT

Spent Hours on His Knees With His Family — A Brooklyn Man Strife From a Lifelong Friend. New York, March 21.—Suffering agencies of remorse that not even the prayers and entreaties of his wife and children could alleviate, George Oehler, who, for the first time in his fifty-seven years of life had been guilty of theft, sought refuge in suicide, yesterday. After he, his wife and their children had spent the night on their knees in prayer in their apartment at 74 Myrtle avenue, Brooklyn, the man, whose misery was more than he could bear, broke off in the midst of a supplication for forgiveness and with a revolver, his wife thought she had hidden, shot himself through the head and died instantly.
