TO HAVE PERMANENCY.

Seeks New York Charter for Carnegie Corporation.

New York, March 24 .- In order to place his numerous charities upon a permanent basis, Andrew Carnegie has had introduced into the legislature at Albany a bill to charter the Carnegie Corporation "for the purpose of conducting the Carnegie projects for the advancement and diffusion of knowledge." The incorporators, besides the Laird of Skibo, are Elihu Root, Henry S. Pritchett, William N. Frew, Robert S. Woodward, Charles S. Taylor, Robert A. Franks and James Bertram. "The Carnegie Corporation will have charge of practically all of Carnegie benefactions," explained one of the incorporators, to-day. "Thus, as can readily be seen, several hundred million dollars will eventually pass through its hands."

The application of petroleum makes the soil physically and physiologically dry, and the plant gradually perishes in consequence of the difficulty of absorbing water. No directly poisonous action of petroleum like that which it exerts on animal organism occurs in the case of plants. The fermentation of solution of sugar is not checked by an addition of petroleum .- Scientific American.




To Cut Down Peach Trees.
