CAUSE OF CALAMITY.

Another tragedy, the death under the most distressing circumstances of nearly an hundred and fifty persons, in New York, has moved the community as it has not been moved in many a day. The Slocum disaster, the greatest water fatality of many years, and occurring so near to land, disturbed the public mind to an extraordinary degree, and caused a searching examination into the condition and equipment of all the steamers that were engaged in the passenger business.

Later a fire in a Chicago theatre, a comparatively new building, and embracing all the modern appliances for the protection of human life, produced a panic in the United States and Canada. The catastrophe, resulting in the loss of many lives, was without a parallel, and again there was a spasmodic movement in the interest of public safety. Public buildings everywhere were subjected to a critical examination and public opinion demanded that they be made to conform to modern ideas.

Now the horror of the New York fire revives the question and there is a hurried chase to see that nothing like it happens again. All the firetraps in the great city will be removed or remodelled. The fire escapes will be made ample and sufficient. A bill before the New York legislature requires an adequate fire alarm system in factories, and the regular drilling of the employees, so that, as the law remarks, these employees "may leave the building quickly without confusion or panic."

Will regret their action. A conservative paper, the Brockville Times, dissents from the sentiments of the Whig, which, in a recent issue, asked what advantage could accrue from the exhibition of partisan spleen in the legislature.

The fact is that Ontario is not the only legislature that has been unnecessarily concerned with this subject. The legislature of Quebec alone displayed the good sense to attend to its own concerns. "Obviously," says the Times, "the fullest expression of Canadian opinion on the matter should be had before it (the trade agreement) goes into force."

MR. BORDEN IN TROUBLE. The leader of the conservative party has been disturbed again, and by rumours of disloyalty. A conservative paper refers to the annual attack on Mr. Borden and in a manner which would indicate its hopelessness, but this paper was one of two or three which set in circulation the reports of party reorganization with incidentally the enforced retirement of Mr. Foster.
