SMOKE NUISANCE EXPENSIVE. Loss of \$17,600,000 for Extra

Laundry and Cleaning. Chicago, April 5 .- The smoke nuisince is responsible for an annual mancial loss to citizens of Chicago oi 17,600,000, or \$8 per capita, in the natter of extra laundry and cleaning, secording to a report made to Mayor lusse, Saturday, by Paul P. Bird, in harge of the department of smoke aspection. The report says:
