



To amend by-law No. 12 regarding pool rooms.

To raise a loan the sum of \$23,588.66 for local improvement.

To construct a common sewer on Brock from a point 150 feet east of Albert street, thence westerly to connect with the sewer in Albert street.

To appoint William McCammon garbage inspector.

To amend by-law No. 29 respecting the widening of streets.

To amend by-law 21 regarding prevention of fires, making it lawful to erect the second storey of a house in certain localities with shingles laid in mortar or on asbestos sheeting.

**Board of Works Matters.**

The recommendation of the Board of Works regarding the type of roadway on a mile of residential streets was adopted. A waterbound macadam will be used.

Ald. Hanley asked if it was the intention of the Board of Works to grade Sydenham street extension in front of the Hotel Dieu. He said the present roadway was in a disgraceful condition and the aldermen agreed with him.

Ald. Rigney replied that he and his committee would be only too glad to have the work done if the council would supply the necessary money. On account of such a small appropriation granted the board for this year it was found impossible to open any of the street extensions the city has bought. What money was appropriated had already been laid out for absolutely necessary work on the streets. The board had asked for \$5,000 for street reopenings, but had not been given anything.

Mayor Graham said that an extra thousand dollars had been given the Board of Works for the purpose of opening Sydenham street.

Ald. Rigney said he was entirely unaware of this.
