It does not pay either the United States or Canada to export flour. It osts money to grind the wheat, barrel the flour, and to export it. It cannot be shipped in bulk. It cannot be sent abroad even in bags. Wheat can be stored and shipped and ground at any time. The United States cannot transport it any cheaper than Canada. All the Americans want enough for their requirements to mix with the softer wheat of the south,


