The debate on reciprocity was again taken up. The first speaker was Thomas MacNutt (Salteonts) for the liberals.

Before the orders of the day were called, Sir Wilfrid Laurier introduced a bill for Hon. Mr. Oliver, "an act respecting the Soughees Indian Reserve." The resolution was as follows: "That it is expedient to provide for the carrying out of a certain agreement of sale made on the 31st WHO KICKED AND BEAT HIS day of March, 1911, between the federal government and the British Columbia government, whereby the Soughees Indian reserve in the city of Victoria, be conveyed or transferred to the British Columbia government

for certain considerations. The prime minister explained that the money was to be paid by the British Columbia government to the head of each family. They would each

receive about \$10,000. Dr. Sproule thought it would more advisable to have the money handled by the dominion government as a trust fund and paid out to each family in the form of an annuity in order to prevent them squandering it.
