Profits of London Subway Railways. The five "tube" railway systems of London showed total gross receipts of \$4,574,443 for last year, the net receipts being \$2,506,448.

After meeting prior charges, one line continued its dividend of three per cent., another its one and three-quarter per cent., and another again skipped a dividend, a fourth paid three-fourths of a per cent., against none for 1909 and a fifth, which paid nothing for 1909, paid three and one-third per cent. for 1910.

The total dividends aggregated \$1,182,236.—Consular Reports.
