BECK IS REQUESTED

TO FORWARD THE HYDRO-
ELECTRIC PRICES.

Ald. R. F. Elliott Wants Them to
Submit to a Meeting of the Eastern
Union of Municipalities.

Ald. R. F. Elliott, chairman of the
union of eastern municipalities in re-
gard to the power question, has written
to him before he leaves for England this
week, the revised prices for power sup-
ply to the municipalities of this dis-
trict. When Mr. Beck was here last
week he had these prices with him, but
did not take the trouble to read them to
the public meeting in the city hall, merely saying that they were
three or four dollars lower than those
given to the meeting of the municipal
representatives at Brockville last
month. They were only estimates in
any case, he said, and the actual
figures would be lower.

However, when asked by Ald. Elliott
to leave the pieces with him, Mr. Beck
declined. The result is that the chair-
man of the union has nothing to submit,
and if Mr. Beck goes away now,
the question of Hydro-Electric power
for this district will be held up till
the fall.

In the meantime, the Seymour com-
pany is going to submit another of-
fer to Kingston. The chairman of the
union of municipalities says that Mr.
Beck does not seem to realize that
municipal bodies must deal with fig-
ures in a matter of this kind, and
that they cannot be swayed by the
success of the Hydro-Electric commis-
sion in the west.

LATE DONALD FISHER, ATHENS.

His First Wife Was a Resident of
Kingston.

Athens, May 16.—After having been
in failing health for the past two
years, and particularly for the past
two months, Duncan Fisher passed
away at his home here on Monday
morning. He was a son of the late Donald
Fisher, Bathurst township, Lanark county, and was born seventy-
years ago. When a young man he
located here, engaged in the business
of carriage making, which business he
carried on with enterprise and integ-
rity until a few years ago. In church
affairs he was active, having been
choir leader and superintendent of the

was liberal. He was twice married.
His first wife was Miss Helen Mitchell,
Kingston, who passed away several
years ago, leaving a family of grown
up sons and a daughter: Mrs. A. L.

railway, (Saskatoon); and Arthur,
Regina. His second wife, who was
Miss Ada Lillian Athens, also
survives. The funeral takes place to-
orrow at 10:30 a.m. to the Methodist
church.
