In the case of horses the disease is treated with a serum, but this never has been used for human beings. Dr. Fowler is at present applying strong antiseptics to the ulcers.

'In looking up the history of the dis ease, Dr. Flynn discovered that up to 1890, there had been only about 400 cases of glanders reported in the world. Of these cases, the majority of the persons affected died.
