Montreal, May 29.—At the Montreal west end stock yard to-day the receipts of live stock were 500 cattle, 200 sheep and lambs, 1,000 hogs, and 350 calves.

The total of last week's receipts were 3,040 cattle, 240 sheep and lambs, 4,500 hogs and 975 calves.

Today's market opened active under a good demand at steady prices generally on cattle. Following are prices received from actual sales of live stock at the West End market:

Steers, shipping, \$8.50 to \$9.50; common, \$5.50 to \$6.50; heavy, \$6.50 to \$7.50; cows, best, \$11.00 to \$12.00; fair, \$8.50 to \$9.50; poor, \$6.50 to \$7.50.
